HOW LOVELY ARE THE MOUNTAINS...

SEEKING THE ULTIMATE VIEW

The quest to discover the ultimate view drives people to push themselves to the limit in incredible climbs to places like Mt Everest, or Mt Rainier, or MT Kilimanjaro. If people can't hike, they will drive up steep elevations to the mountain outlook to see the view. Others will drive to the rim of the Grand Canyon to look up and down and view the majesty held there. There is even a see-thru viewing ledge that has been built out over the canyon for viewing the beauty of the Colorado River 5000 feet below. At that height, the river below looks like a trickling brook. In Maine, the elevation of the "Height of the Land" vista does not have that elevation, but the view of the spectacular sunset on the horizon on a clear day is beyond words. The drive to see or climb such heights is in everyone's heart. Why? Every person has an internal and eternal spirit within themselves from the beginning.

THE QUEST TO SEE AND ENJOY

The quest for the Ultimate of views comes to us in various locations and elevations. One might require a difficult climb of 29,035 feet to the summit of Mt Everest. Others find the same level of beauty and satisfaction at much lower elevations such as Hacker's Hill in Maine sitting at 753 ft. The two extremes of elevation, each with their own amazing panoramic views support the same spirit of curiosity, inquiry and seeking in the quest.

THE SPIRIT OF INQUIRY AND CURIOSITY

This spirit of inquiry and curiosity is not taught externally in a public school curriculum, a military boot camp, or in colleges. It is an internal gift from God, the Creator.
